

FROM ONLINE TO IN-PERSON

We recommend that you become familiar with <u>KEATS</u>, King's e-learning platform. Your reading list, lecture slides, and other supplementary material will be uploaded here.

Finding your lecture hall or classrooms can be tricky! Ensure that you have enough time to get to your lessons. Ask the receptionist for help if you need directions.

ACADEMIC TIPS

- Always attend lectures in person and then watch the recording for maximum retention
- Submit all formative assessments while their grade won't be counted, they can reveal essential factors, tips, and weaknesses you could've made in the summative assessment
- Your professors are just an email away! Compile multiple queries and book an office hour for support in academia
- Take full advantage of the journal article databases
 King's has access to
- Make a calendar with all your assessment deadlines at the start of the term
- Make notes of your lectures alongside the online recordings to gain a simplified and personalised understanding



TIP #1 - TAKING NOTES

Freshers often invest too much time in note-taking rather than learning and understanding the lecture content. Ensure that you have enough time for revision!



TRANSPORT

The London tube is the fastest way to travel long distances across central London.

The bus is also a great alternative if you don't like the underground or want to save money. It's also a nice way to sightsee while commuting on the top floor of a double-decker bus!

To pay for your journey, you can use an Oyster Card which you can get from all tube and overground stations. Alternatively, you can pay using contactless bank cards or mobile payment.

London is big and finding your way can get tricky! Navigation is made easier with your preferred map app. We recommend Citymapper as it only helps you find your way but also tells you the cost of travelling. You can also use Google Maps to find your way.





TIP #2 - USING THE TUBE

- Check the tube map carefully make sure you are on the correct platform
- Check the final destination of the incoming train make sure you board the correct train that goes in the right direction and that will stop at your preferred destination
- Stand on the right side of the escalators

PACKING FOR LONDON WEATHER

You do not want to be soaking wet when you get home like the man in the blue shirt. Be prepared for the unpredictable London weather during the autumn and winter seasons by packing the following items:

- A warm coat
- An umbrella
- Pair of gloves
- Waterproof shoes

On the other hand, London summers bring along bright and warm days, making them the perfect time to go for a picnic, a cycle ride or enjoy the great outdoors – be prepped with a casual temperate wardrobe.

The weather app is the best gauge of what the day will look like – and is the most accurate on the same morning. Temperatures generally range from 4°C to 23°C in London.



FOOD

London offers one of the most diverse food ranges of any city in the world – offering nearly every cuisine.

Budgeting is made easy by using a variety of apps to aid in the daily consolidation of your money, such as Spendee, Splitwise and the ever-convenient Monzo.

Having the status of a student can avail a wide variety of student-specific discounts. These are some of them:

- <u>18+ Student Oyster photocard</u>- All students above the age of 18, can apply for this and save 30% on their Travelcards and Bus & Tram Pass season tickets.
- <u>Tesco Clubcard</u>- The loyalty card helps you purchase groceries at a lower price in-store as well as online.
- Student discount schemes <u>UNiDAYs</u> and <u>Student</u>
 <u>Beans</u> provide access to multiple deals while
 shopping online. This includes saving at brands like
 Apple, Urban Outfitters, H&M, and restaurants like
 Domino's and Las Iguanas.

TIP #4

It would be best to carry your student ID card with you, as many places offer student discounts, but require ID proof. So don't miss out on an opportunity to save a few pounds just because you don't have your ID on you!
